

At the event, WinVinaya's representative spoke about neurodiversity inclusion — sharing how **AI tools** are helping candidates with autism, ADHD, and other neurodivergent profiles better understand platforms like **Excel**

She also highlighted our specialized training in **Document Remediation**, **Zoho Bookkeeping**, and **job-ready** skills tailored for neurodiverse individuals.

Empowering Women in Tiruppur: Insights from District Job Fair



On March 28, 2025, our team participated in the **District Job Fair at the Collector Office, Tiruppur**, with a focus on employment

for persons with disabilities (PWDs) and women.

While the number of PWD attendees was limited, we made valuable connections with recruiters and understood emerging market needs for digital and bookkeeping skills.

Most importantly, we met **15 enthusiastic women graduates**, who are now part of our **new training cohort**, as we expand our efforts to **empower more women through targeted digital upskilling**.

What We Achieved:

- Aligned our training programs with updated recruiter expectations
- Initiated dialogues with companies for future PWD and women placements
- Added 15 motivated women to our skilling pipeline

Next Steps:

- Strengthen outreach and visibility in Tier-2 regions like Tiruppur
- Focused training to bridge identified skill gaps and boost placement rates

This wasn't a one-off gesture—it was a **step toward longterm inclusive engagement**, where technology meets empathy, and corporate goodwill meets lived experience.

Learning to Empower: NIMHANS Students Explore Disability Inclusion with WinVinaya



On April 24, 2025, we welcomed 19 bright minds from **NIMHANS**—including psychiatric residents, Ph.D. scholars, and social work interns—for an immersive

exposure visit focused on disability inclusion and empowerment.

What They Experienced

- Indian Sign Language in Action A lively, interactive workshop led by **Rahul**, our trainer with hearing and speech impairment, broke communication barriers right from the start
- Stories that Shift Perspectives Ratna, Yogita, Arun, and Kasthuri shared real journeys of persons with disabilities—covering their training, challenges, breakthroughs, and successful placements
- **Inclusive Hiring Demystified** A candid Q&A session with **Danetta** offered insights into how inclusive hiring is not just possible, but practical and powerful

This visit wasn't just a field trip—it was a mindset shift. Future mental health and social work professionals walked away with deeper empathy, new tools, and a stronger resolve to champion **disability inclusion** in their own spheres.
