- **Jogesh**, a photographer with hearing and speech impairment, captured every moment with creativity that spoke louder than words.

The day wasn't just fun. It was an invitation - to adapt, to communicate differently, to see challenges as possibilities. And when we shared payasam at the end, it wasn't just sweet - it was a taste of belonging.

This Onam, we didn't just celebrate tradition. We lived inclusion.

SVP-LPs Visit: Breaking Barriers Together

Real change doesn't happen in isolation — it happens when **partnerships align with purpose**. This week, we had the privilege of hosting **SVP-LPs** in our office — Mr. Mukul &

Mr. Abraham (Abe), alongside our WinVinaya team (Shiva, Akila, Baskaran, Guru, and Jannet).

The conversations were deeply focused, not just on challenges but on solutions rooted in commitment and collaboration. Together, we explored:



- Enabling deaf candidate placements by opening employer network across industries (manufacturing, finance, BPOs).
- Strengthening **financial & digital literacy** for MSMEs to build inclusive capacity.
- Building a **Centre of Excellence (CoE)** for R&D, innovation, and trainer capacity.
- Enhancing visibility & credibility through success stories, PR, and thought leadership.
- Mapping fundraising pathways CSR, government, and philonthropy - for sustainable impact.

- Inclusion in action: Cup Tower Challenge & reimagined Musical Chairs (10 people, 2 chairs — proving there's always space when inclusion leads)
- Indian Sign Language session by Rajat & National Anthem in ISL- a moment of unity and pride.
- Photography by Jogesh, whose lens captured every expression of inclusion.

With 15 candidates, trainers, interns, and PwDs celebrating as equals, the day remined us: **inclusion isn't a concept**, **it's action lived together**.
