# Focused Placement Drives — Getting Talent to the Right Roles

This month, we deepened our employer partnerships through focused placement drives, especially with Sutherland and Tata Elxsi.

Instead of a generic approach, these drives are intentionally designed to improve the hit rate by aligning closely with each organisation's expectations.

Across both drives, we:

- Understood role requirements and workplace realities
- Mapped the right set of candidates to the right jobs
- Supported candidates in preparation and interview readiness
- Enabled accessible interviews through sign language interpretation and, for Deaf candidates, chat-based interactions
- Coordinated communication and follow-ups, and now wait for final outcomes

At Sutherland, 19 candidates were shortlisted for Customer Support roles across locations, including Deaf



candidates, candidates with locomotor disabilities, and one

At Tata Elxsi, 13 candidates interviewed (onsite and virtual), with panels appreciating their skills, adaptability, and the use of assistive technologies such as voice-to-text tools.

These drives reaffirm what we see every day:

When recruitment processes become accessible, talent doesn't just show up – it shines.

#### **Zoho Skills in Action: From Workflows to Jobs**

This month, WinVinaya Foundation was invited to

a Zoho webinar for nonprofits on "Nonprofit ZUG: How Technology Can Accelerate Inclusion and Access for All."



Shiva shared how we use

Zoho tools to run our operations more efficiently – from:

- Generating donor reports in Zoho Books, to
- Building applications like Job Habba in Zoho Creator to manage jobs and opportunities.
- The most powerful moment came from Rajat, our Deaf team member, who demonstrated live how he:
- Creates donor receipts and reports in minutes using Zoho Books
- Tags different donors accurately without doubletagging
- Generates donation acknowledgements quickly so donors receive timely, clear communication

It was more than a software demo. It was a proof of what's possible when tools are accessible and people are trusted.

Beyond our internal use, we also train persons with disabilities and women in Zoho tools, enabling them to:

- Manage finance workflows,
- Handle project operations, and
- Build digital systems confidently in their workplaces.

At WinVinaya, technology isn't just about automation.

It is a bridge to skill, opportunity, and dignity.
