#### **HUMANS OF WINVINAYA!**

Hello from the Humans of WinVinaya. This month, we thought of walking you through our talented Dancers and how they entertained us all thoroughly for two whole days. Are you ready? Let's go back to the day when we celebrated the International Day of Sign Languages.

On our music system, we started playing a movie song and immediately about 12 to 13 of our associates and candidates rocked the dance floor. People were cheering, grooving, and followed by it was a huge round of applause for the entire team. The coordination of the team members was mind blowing and everyone in the room raved about that. Now that you know what an amazing performance it was, let us give you one additional piece of information; more than half of them were Persons with Hearing Impairment.

In the world of the Deaf where silence is all they hear, dancing to music alongside a Hearing Person is a big deal. It took them weeks of practice and dedication to awestrike a big crowd. Every day, the rest of us witnessed them watching YouTube videos, figuring out the movements and feeling the beat without a single note of music.

Audience had a lot of questions for them— they wanted to understand how the Deaf dancers coordinated so beautifully without the music/ melody and this is what the deaf candidates shared-

"It's ok even if we cannot hear the music. By looking at the video, we can count the steps, the gaps and the beats. We memorise the movements, assign numbers to them and just like that, we can also dance. It is not that hard really; all you need to do is enjoy and dance your heart out!"

For many of the Hearing People present that day, it was the first time they witnessed persons with hearing impairment dancing along with persons with intellectual disabilities, persons without disabilities and the experience was truly refreshing and awakening. Let us shatter myths, negative bias through arts, games, fun and laughter!
