DISABILITY AWARENESS ORIENTATION

At WinVinaya, we are redefining learning with our unique approach. Our experiential learning does not just educate – it engages, empowers, and includes individuals with disabilities along with the audience in fun-filled activities. In August, WinVinaya held an inhouse Disability Awareness Orientation (DAO) for CGI.

The event kicked off with an engaging game, highlighting how diverse abilities can equally cherish life's simple joys. The sensitization program delved deep into disabilities, spotlighting visual, hearing, speech, and locomotor impairments through interactive activities. Real-life triumphs demonstrated that with determination and support, individuals can conquer challenges and achieve greatness.

Participants learned sign language basics, underlining the power of inclusive communication. Small gestures can bridge gaps and integrate individuals with disabilities. The orientation also explored corporate best practices for fostering inclusive workspaces.

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DEI - INITIATIVES @ WINVINAYA

We are embracing new challenges, convinced that growth requires pushing beyond the comfort zones. While our main goal is to train and place individuals with disabilities, we are taking outsourced projects from progressive organizations which are executed with quality and speed by an inclusive team. We are also sharing the know-how of recruiting, integrating Persons with Disabilities with the wider community to amplify the social impact.

Accessibility Testing - Presently, we are collaborating with a company, testing their recruitment portal for accessibility to ensure that it is useful for all, including persons with Visual accessibility impairments. Our experts – а combination individuals of with visual impairments and those sighted, who are successfully completed this project.

Document Remediation - We are transforming digital textbooks for a blind school across 6^{th} standard to 10^{th} standard, making them accessible so that they can learn through these books anytime they want. We validated this process with input from someone with visual impairment.

Simultaneously, we are driving an **Accounting Automation initiative** for a CA firm, streamlining processes, reducing errors, saving effort, and achieving results at extreme speed. We are automating invoices, bill creation, generating TDS and GST reports. All this was done by an inclusive team which increases the diversity quotient of the company as well.

Curious about our training. Which companies recruited our candidates for what roles, who are available for recruitment? Many companies inquire about candidates availability, education qualifications, disability categories, and job roles. To meet this need, we've revamped our Power BI dashboard – an interactive tool for transparent data visualization. <u>Check it out!</u>

Marimuthu, a dedicated trainer at WinVinaya Foundation, embodies strength and resilience. His journey began in an unfamiliar world of visual impairment, facing challenges while growing up with his grandparents. It was not until the age of 9 that he connected with his own community. School was not easy; Marimuthu was the only one with a disability, struggling to grasp concepts even as basic as Braille.

But life took a turn. In the 5th grade, Marimuthu joined an inclusive school. Here, he delved into Braille and explored various subjects, connecting with a community of visually impaired individuals. Through his hard work and dedication, he became the sole family member to earn a master's degree while living with a disability.

His master's degree marked not an endpoint, but the start of fresh aspirations. Pursuing a computer diploma ignited his passion for learning and working in the field.

Guided by supportive mentors, he joined WinVinaya's Accessibility Testing training program which had some theory and more practical courses.

Marimuthu's determination led him to an even greater role – a WinVinaya trainer. He is empowering visually impaired children by training them in digital skills, to excel in exams, and nurturing their self-reliance.
