CORPORATE COLLABORATIONS

WinVinaya Foundation has been actively engaging in corporate collaborations to foster understanding, inclusivity, and empowerment. This month, we had the privilege of conducting impactful sessions with esteemed organizations, resulting in profound experiences and positive outcomes.

Our journey began with a powerful Disability Sensitization Session at a Fortune 500 company, where over 25 passionate employees joined us for an enlightening journey. Beginning with an insightful introduction to WinVinaya and an exploration of different disabilities, the session quickly evolved into an immersive experience. Through Sensory Safari (experiential disability sensitization focused on Visual Impairment) and ISL Sprint (shedding inhibition in learning ISL, just in 15 mins) sparking empathy, understanding, and action.

Attending the annual family event of BNI Titans was another enriching experience for the WinVinaya team. The highlight of the event was a thoughtprovoking drama addressing excessive mobile phone usage, performed by our trainers with speech and hearing impairment. Shiva Jayagopal, co-founder of WinVinaya Foundation, shared insights about our mission and social impact. The event helped us in showcasing our community work and enhancing inclusivity awareness among attendees.

WinVinaya hosted Marlabs LLC for an insightful disability sensitization session, enriched by leaders from the USA and India. Presentations by employees with disabilities on how persons with Visual Impairment use screen readers, create insightful and interactive charts in Microsoft Power BI, complemented by interactive activities including learning the basics of sign language, fostering inclusive learning experiences for all participants.



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NGO/COLLEGE COLLABORATION

WinVinaya Foundation empowers young minds to make a difference in the lives of persons with disabilities. This month, 3 MBA students from NMIMS College joined our internship, bringing innovative ideas to enhance connections between candidates and companies, improving placement opportunities. Interns gain experiential learning by interacting with diverse disabilities, learning sign language basics, and understanding inclusivity barriers and solutions. WinVinaya provides a platform for talent to contribute to empowerment, gaining skills and experiences for their future.

Additionally, we're thrilled to announce our collaboration with Kannada Tantramsha, a voluntary group dedicated to empowering individuals with visual impairments. In response to Gmail's transition to a standard view, we conducted a focused training workshop aimed at empowering 15 individuals with visual impairments to navigate Gmail's standard view with ease, maximizing its accessibility features. Special thanks to our dedicated volunteers – Aravind and Justin from Rotary Abilities, Rajesh Kini from Accenture, Kavya the Ph.D. scholar, and Gatak Singh the SDA Clerk – alongside our expert trainers Arun Kumar S, Mustaq Ahamad, Yogitha Ar, and Chandan H S for their invaluable contributions in making the workshop a success!



PLACEMENT HIGHLIGHTS

We are thrilled to announce that this month, we successfully placed a total of 21 candidates. 20 are individuals with hearing and speech impairment, while 1 candidate has a locomotor disability.

We thank the inclusive companies – Concentrix (16 candidates), Guru and Jana – a leading CA firm (4 candidates) and Sutherland (1 candidate). This accomplishment is a testament to the hard work and dedication of the candidates, our trainers and the inclusive mindset of progressive companies.
