Celebrating the Valedictory Ceremony of BFSI and IT Training Batches



On September 13, WinVinaya Foundation proudly celebrated the valedictory ceremony of our BFSI and IT training batch, which empowered candidates with various disabilities. The BFSI batch sponsored by TE Connectivity included 8 candidates with locomotor disabilities and 2 women from Bengaluru. The IT batch included 3 candidates with locomotor disabilities and 5 women. The training program provided vital skills for the financial and IT sectors.

In BFSI training, the curriculum included basic English, soft skills, MS Office, financial accounting, core banking, Tally, Power BI, and Zoho. In IT Full Stack Development training, candidates learned Java, SQL, HTML5, CSS3, Angular, Agile, as well as Software Testing and Test Automation, including SW Testing fundamentals, alongside English and soft skills.

We were honored to have Ms. Pratigya, a Talent Acquisition Recruiter from Amazon, whose presence and encouraging words inspired our graduates as they prepared to step into their professional careers.

Mari Muthu, a person with visual impairment, showcased how he navigates a laptop with a screen reader which enables him to be productive and efficient, while Nagaratna, a person with locomotor, shared her inspiring journey of teaching digital literacy to micro and small enterprises.

This impactful session fostered a deeper understanding of inclusivity, offering valuable insights to participants about the potential of persons with disabilities in the workforce.
